Land Trust Preserves 12th Property

Working with the MacDonald's Island Cottage Association, the Trust has preserved its 12th property.

This property, to be known as the MacDonald's Wetland, has 3000 feet of shoreline and is part of the Provincially Significant Big Rideau Lake Wetland Complex. It is located just off Highway 15 on the eastern edge of Portland. This property makes a valuable addition to neighbouring wetlands already protected by the Conservation Authority and Ministry of Natural Resources.

The property includes a large bay that is dominated by cattails. In the summer, it provides habitat to literally hundreds of Red-winged Blackbirds. A second bay is part of the provincial fish sanctuary which plays an important role in sustaining the fish populations in our lakes.



The woodlands surrounding these bays are forested with Sugar Maple, Beech and Hemlock. On the day that Simon Lunn, the Trust's volunteer biologist, visited the site to prepare the Baseline Documentation Report, a Great Horned Owl was being "mobbed" by several dozen Crows and two Blue Jays while a **Red-shouldered Hawk** was calling out while circling above.

The habitat provided by both the wetlands and the surrounding woodlands will provide a valuable contribution to the ecological health of the Rideau Corridor for generations to come.

The Rideau Waterway Land Trust welcomes the opportunity to work with the MacDonald's Island Cottage Association in the continued preservation of these important wetlands.



Threats to the *Red-shouldered Hawk*

Habitat loss impacts heavily on Red-shouldered Hawks. Destruction of huge expanses of timberland has severely limited suitable habitat, hence population sizes. Forest cutting and filling in of wetlands has diminished the numbers of available prey. Competition from Red-tailed Hawks and Great Horned Owls prohibits nesting in smaller woodlots. Both competitors are more able than the Red-shouldered Hawk to withstand the changing environmental conditions. Since the Red-tailed Hawk mates earlier in the season, it often usurps nesting sites previously established by a Red-shouldered Hawk. Humans have shot the bird, destroyed its nests and killed hatchlings. Effects of chemical poisoning are uncertain. Eggshell thinning and premature breakage have been reported.

What is a Baseline Documentation Report?

As a member of the Ontario Land Trust Alliance, the Rideau Waterway Land Trust has adopted the Statement of Standards and Practices as the ethical and technical guideline for the responsible operation of a land trust.

As part of the Standards and Practices, the land trust prepares a Baseline Documentation Report for each of the properties or easements it acquires. This document is an accurate representation of the property at the time the trust accepts the donation or purchases the property. The report consists of maps, a depiction of all existing human-made modifications, prominent vegetation, identification of flora and fauna, land use history, distinct natural features and photographs. The report is used to set a standard for measurement and annual monitoring to ensure that the natural features of the land are not disturbed in the future.

Our trust is very fortunate to have Simon Lunn, a recently retired senior Parks Canada biologist, who volunteers his time to help with the preparation of Baseline Documentation Reports.
