This island will be preserved in its natural state for the enjoyment of all users of the Rideau Waterway. The Trust would like to congratulate the Brown Family for their continued support.

Since its incorporation in 1996 the volunteers of the Trust have acquired 90 acres with over 6000 feet of waterfront along the Rideau Waterway. It's a great start.

## **Ontario Nature Trust Alliance**

The Rideau Waterway Land Trust, through its continued support of this Alliance, continues to work toward some relief from property taxes that land trusts are levied on the lands they own. The Alliance believes that the volunteers of the land trust movement are working hard to preserve ecological lands for the

public benefit and as such should be entitled to some form of property tax relief. The provincial government is working with us to find a solution to the property tax issue.

ONTA welcomes the Federation of Ontario Cottage Associations on board as an associate member. FOCA brings the voice of over 85,000 members in support of the land trust movement in Ontario.

#### **Business Plan Completed**

The Board of Directors recently approved the Rideau Waterway Land Trust Business Plan 2000 – 2005. The plan calls for continued growth during this period and an expansion of activities to include additional areas within the Rideau Corridor. The land acquisition program is expected to remain strong throughout this period. Special emphasis will be placed on fundraising for the Land Management Endowment Fund. It is important that funds be available, in perpetuity, for the care of the lands entrusted to the Rideau Waterway Land Trust.

The plan is currently being published and will be available shortly.
